


Wednesday Dinners...

At this same point in 2011, we had received \$110,955 less than we needed to operate. This year your consistent, regular giving has enabled us to avoid using our credit line or cash reserves. We have received \$62,422 more than we have expended so far this year. AND...we have paid 80% of our apportionments to the Conference and District.

We are in this position for three reasons: careful management of our budget by staff and ministry team leaders, consistent payment of pledges by our members, and generous gifts from members and friends who support Wesley Memorial but do not pledge.
