Worship at Wesley Memorial

Since I became your pastor last July, there has been an on-going conversation about the number and times of worship services which will be offered at Wesley Memorial. At the heart of these conversations was a desire to provide worship opportunities and times that met the diverse needs of our congregation, provides consistent liturgical and preaching leadership by our clergy, and honors the traditional Sunday School hour.

Although none of our worship services fully utilize the space they occupy, they all have attendance that is significant enough to make the merger of any one of them questionable. In fact, a couple of our services have actually shown a slight increase in average attendance in recent months. While we never actually surveyed any of the existing services to determine their willingness to merge with another service, we never felt any strong support for such a move. We have explored a number of times and formats, but none of them promised to significantly improve on our current schedules.

I am aware that all this conversation and exploration has troubled and confused many. Therefore, in consultation with the staff and on my recommendation, the Church Council has decided that Wesley Memorial will continue to offer the existing worship formats, schedules, and venues; and we will offer this same schedule during the summer months.

8:30 am – Traditional Worship in the Chapel 8:45 am – Contemporary Worship in the Fellowship Hall 9:45 am – Contemporary Worship in the Fellowship Hall 11:00 am – Traditional Worship in the Sanctuary

At the discretion of the clergy staff, the worship schedule may be occasionally altered for seasonal and/or programmatic reasons. Although the schedule of these "occasional services" is not yet complete, we have planned for only ONE SERVICE at 11 am on Memorial Day Weekend, May 27, 2012. I trust this announcement will help clarify any confusion or uncertainty. I believe that worship is vital to our mission of "making and sustaining spiritually healthy followers of Jesus Christ" and I hope that you will continue to find your place among the worshipping congregations at Wesley Memorial. Grief Support Class

We will be offering a grief support class beginning on Monday, May 7 at 9:30 am. This will be a five (5) week class where we will explore our own grief and other people's grief. The cost is \$20 which will cover materials and two books, and will be located in the youth area (7th grade classroom). The books are available at the Front Desk. This is a class for anyone who knows grief, whether through death or loss of some other kind.

Are you stressed out? What does the Bible teach us about how to deal with the stress in our life?

This class begins Wednesday, May 2 at 6:30 pm. Cobb Atkinson, Head of the Westchester Country Day School, will be offering a class called **Stress and Solutions in the Christian Life**. In this study, we will consider how God's Word speaks to us as Christians about the root causes and consequences of stress. We will look closely at scripture to better understand the spiritual assets that we have been given to manage adversity and challenge in our lives. 

Wesley 100 serves at Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church

After many years of inactivity of a United Methodist Men chapter at Wesley Memorial, a group of men, led by Jim Groome and Dan Smoak, organized a new chapter in early 2006 and named it "The Wesley 100," based on a paraphrased quote from John Wesley..."Give me a hundred men who love God and hate evil and I'll change the world." The goal of the group is to help men become better Christians, fathers and husbands. The Bible verse that reflects this from Proverbs 27:17, "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another," is their motto. Pete Thompson has served as president since 2010.

The Wesley 100's initial projects included hosting the "Seven Seasons of a Man's Life" seminar which resulted in the start-up of several men's Small Groups, the "Letters from Dad" seminar, and building staging for the Youth Program.

The group supports the missions and outreach of Wesley Memorial with funds and manpower. Fundraising projects include selling Christmas trees that members cut in the North Carolina mountains, serving pancakes and sausage at the annual Shrove Tuesday Dinner, and an annual "Chicken'n' Fixins" dinner in the summer. Through these and other events, the Wesley 100 has raised more than \$18,000 since 2006. This has funded projects such as:

- *Furnishing two scholarships and a cow for the Nakuru Mission School in Kenya,
- *Medicines for a bush clinic in Kenya,
- *Renovating and expanding "Matthew's Shelter" for a refugee family in High Point,
- *Funding scholarships for the Henderson Settlement Mission in the Kentucky mountains,
- *Helping support programs at Ward Street Mission, the Open Door Ministries and Newman's Recovery Center,
- *Supporting the church's youth programs and
- *Cooking for numerous events for the church such as Trunk or Treat, The Crop Walk and Springfest.

In early 2012, the Wesley 100 took responsibility for preparing the church's Wednesday Night meals from January to May. Future projects that are being considered include helping fund a new playground for the Wesley Memorial School program and supporting the Children's Home in Winston-Salem.



CONGREGATIONAL CARE MINISTRY IS EXPANDING!

A. NEW FELLOWSHIP GROUPS. As more of our older adults move to retirement communities we have organized Wesley Fellowship groups at Pennybyrn and Piedmont Crossing. The Pennybyrn group is meeting the second Wednesday of each month and the Piedmont Crossing group is meeting once a quarter beginning May 1. Approximately 99.5% of our residents in each retirement community have attended our first meetings and enthusiastically welcomed this new ministry. Including the group which meets monthly at River Landing, we now have three fellowship groups which have 60 members of our church family participating. While "fellowship" is our main purpose at these gatherings, it is a time when these residents are informed about members of our church family who have been hospitalized, who have ongoing health issues and who are dealing with grief following the loss of family members or friends. There is also time for having fun and a brief worship experience. Our newest Clergy staff members have attended and been introduced to the residents.

B. THE PILLOW MINISTRY. Our pillow ministry continues to involve and touch many lives at Wesley. Recently 45 new pillows were completed and are ready to be shared. Our Sunday School sixth graders recently stuffed 32 pillows and a team of a couple of dozen adults finished them last week at a "pillow party" at Susan Ravenel's home.
