Children & Family Ministry charts future



Annette Saftrom and Sara Bailey, two consultants from Ministry Architects spent three days in April at Wesley Memorial meeting with leadership, parents, volunteers and others interested in the long term sustainability of our children's ministry.

They evaluated our assets-strengths in the current children's ministry, as well as our challenges-obstacles to moving the children's ministry strategically forward. After talking with over 50 individuals in small listening groups the consultants were able to make recommendations as well as develop an eighteen month step-by-step "blueprint" of exactly how we can move the children's ministry from where we are to where we want to be.

The Children and Family Ministry team is beginning to identify four to five volunteers who are non-anxious, goal-oriented people who can focus on the recommendations and tasks in the detailed timeline laying out the process month by month.

This summer we will enjoy fellowship poolside at High Point Country Club where we learn about Godly character and how we can apply it to our lives. The




poolside bible study will run on July 10, 24, 31 and August 7 at 11:30. Children and Youth who are members of the Club are invited to attend. More info to come!

Middle School Mission Trip




There will be no adult Sunday school classes meeting in the month of July. The joint class, along with other Sunday school classes, will pick up again August 4.

So Much to Celebrate! Africa Trip Reveals Ways Wesley Memorial is Transforming the World!

Russ Pierce and Adam Vernon returned May 14 from their 11 day trip to South Africa and Kenya. The purpose of their trip was to do observations and assessments of our mission partnerships in Africa. They came back simply amazed by how God has worked through Wesley Memorial over the last 25 years in Africa. Here are a few highlights:

Wesley Memorial Primary School Mayflower, Mpuluzi, South Africa.

We were amazed by how the school has developed over the years. Currently, over 700 students are enrolled in K-7th grade levels. They have recently won a regional award for their library and are looking to build a new building to house it. We did learn that the school has actually been a government school since 1995 which was new news to us at Wesley Memorial.



Kenya Partners Nakuru, Kenya

Kenya Partners is an independent 501c3 nonprofit led by Diane Hamrick and operating in Nakuru, Kenya. They then work in partnership with United Methodists from the East Africa Annual Conference. They work primarily on four projects: Squatters Hill PreSchool, Mercy PreSchool, Wesley Medical Clinic, and the United Methodist Mission School.

Wesley Memorial has helped with funding various projects in Nakuru over the last few years and is providing a grant in 2013 to build housing for school administrators at the UM Mission School.

Wesley Memorial's first major project in Kenya was the purchase of a building for Wesley Medical Clinic in 2006.



Maua Methodist Hospital and Maua Methodist Circuit Maua, Kenya

Wesley Memorial's partners in Maua directly with Maua Methodist Hospital and Maua Methodist Circuit which is part of the Methodist Church of Kenya. Three United Methodist Churches in Greensboro (Guilford College, Christ, and West Market Street) are also actively involved there.

Last year Wesley Memorial funded the expansion of Clarke Early Childhood Development School. This year we are funding construction of staff housing at Ndoleli Clinic – a clinic whose construction we funded in 2006.


