Howle Announces Retirement

Reverend Richard Howle, Pastor of Congregational Care, has announced that he will retire effective June 30, 2013.

In making his announcement, Richard wrote, "Rarely does a minister have the privilege of beginning and ending his ministry in the same church. In June 1958 I was ordained into conference membership and was assigned as a student intern at Wesley Memorial. (I am probably one of the few living people who turned a spade of dirt at the groundbreaking of this marvelous church that summer.) I am now closing my ministry here on the same high note on which it began. My ministry here the past nine years has been both fulfilling and most enjoyable." Richard has served with four different senior pastors. His ministry was focused on pastoral care with persons who were homebound or lived in retirement communities and skilled care facilities; he tirelessly visited every hospitalized member of Wesley Memorial, preached and presided over the Wednesday Communion Service, and led the Congregational Care Team.

Senior Pastor, Al Ward said of Richard, "People love his visits, enjoy his sense of humor, and are comforted by his funeral homilies. Everyone is going to miss Richard." Al continued, "He has been pastor and friend to everyone at Wesley Memorial and that includes me. It has been a joy and a blessing to be in ministry with Richard and Elizabeth."

Richard is actually re-retiring. He retired the first time in 2002, after 46 years of ministry that included serving some of the leading churches in the Confer-



ence and a term as district superintendent. The good news of this announcement is that Richard and Elizabeth are going to continue to make Wesley Memorial their church home. "We are going to be right there in our pew on Sundays, except when we visit our grandchildren, and supporting the ministries of this wonderful church. We love all of you and look forward to our continued relationship with Wesley Memorial," Richard said.

The Staff Parish Relations Committee will be announcing an event to celebrate Richard's ministry. They also are turning their attention to a plan to continue the vital ministry to the older members of Wesley Memorial.



Wesley Memorial Continues Support for Mission Partnerships Beyond High Point

Wesley Memorial's ministry extends far beyond the walls of our campus and far beyond High Point. As we live in ways that transform the world we are in ministry across the world. The 2013 Global Mission Grants approved by your Global Missions Team and Church Council include grant support for projects for three of our long-term mission partnerships: Henderson Settlement in Kentucky; Nakuru, Kenya; and Maua, Kenya. Our other long-term mission partnership with Wesley Memorial School in Kangwane, South Africa did not receive a grant from the operating budget in anticipation of funding through other sources and special offerings later this year. The Global Mission Team also set aside funds for Mission Scholarships.

Global Missions Team Looking to the Future

The Global Missions Team has begun a deliberate process of assessing our current overseas partnerships and discerning what our partnerships should "look like" moving in the future. As the work in creating a partnership framework moves forward they're considering

these questions:

- 1. What resources do we bring to relationships with our overseas ministry partners?
- 2. What impact do we want these relationships to have on our members and the congregation as a whole? What kind of transformation do we want to see?
- 3. What impact do we want to have on those with whom we partner?
- 4. How will be build and maintain these relationships over a 3-5 year period?
- 5. How will we review each relationship and know when God is calling us to new relationships with other partners?

The Global Mission Team anticipates this process continuing through much of the year. As part of the assessment process Russ Pierce, our Executive Pastor, and Adam Vernon, Director of Student Ministries, will travel to South Africa and Kenya in early May to visit our three existing ministry partnerships along with another potential new partner. Adam is preparing for a Summer 2014 Student Ministries Team to Kenya. Russ has prior experience doing observations and assessments for the General Board of Global Ministries and the Congregation at Duke University Chapel. They will gather information for the Global Mission Team to use in their ongoing discernment. Watch the May HeartBeat for more information about their trip.
