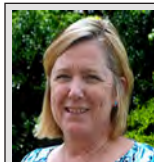

Dr. Storey was pastor and Bishop in the Methodist Church of South Africa; and was a central figure in the dismantling of apartheid. He has also been on the faculty of Duke Divinity School. Thirty members of the **Chancel Choir** and **Choral Scholars** presented a 30-minute program of anthems, solos and readings from Psalms at Westchester Harbor on September 21 at 5 pm. Afterwards, they enjoyed food and fellowship at Olive Garden. ***On Sunday, October 5, the men of the choir with members from the congregation will sing in worship.*** Please watch the bulletin for other short-term opportunities for Men and Women's Choruses. Be sure to mark on your calendars ***Sunday, December 7, when the Chancel Choir presents A Ceremony of Carols*** by one of Britain's foremost twentieth century composers, Benjamin Britten. After being published for SSA choir in 1943, the immense popularity of the work led the publisher to commission an SATB version which was published in 1955. Britten chose ancient poems and Gregorian chant for texts with harp accompaniment. The Chancel Choir and soloists will be accompanied by two harps.

Children's music for 2-5 graders was very successful in September. Seventeen children participated in playing instruments and singing before Sunday School. They

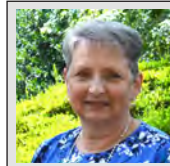


also worked on a fun speech-only piece while learning Philippians 4:8, and sang the Introit at 11 am for two consecutive Sundays. PLAYGROUND ALERT! Children At Play!

Full installation of new equipment is being completed by early October. The children of WMS and community are ecstatic! We wish to express heartfelt gratitude for the OVERWHELMING support of the entire Wesley Memorial congregation and our school families for successful fundraising efforts during the past year. In addition to full installation, the monies raised supported costs of demolition and removal of the old equipment, fine grading of land, and rain drain installation underground.

Level I has been re-designed for younger children, ages 6 months-2 years. Level I's new equipment includes: a low climbing structure, playhouse, to-and-fro double toddler swing, infant swing, border and mulch.



Level III has been re-designed for preschool children, ages 2-5 years. Level III's new equipment includes: a tree-themed climbing structure with "animals" in the tree, wishbone balance beam, crawl-thru log tunnel, "secret messages" talk center, borders and mulch.

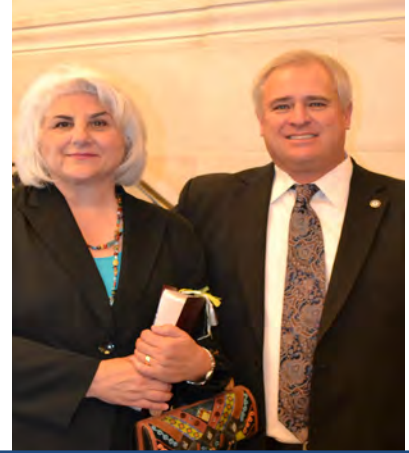
