Wesley 100 is selling Christmas Trees again this year.



This is a great way to be environmentally conscious, as well as to help out those of us who are more comfortable with technology and/or more forgetful of just where we might have laid down that beautiful Advent devotional...

Submissions Needed!

We are accepting submissions from all arenas: Whether it's a memory you have of a special holiday tradition, a meaningful Scripture or story you always remember this time of year, or a reflection upon a difficult or challenging Christmas you've endured, we want to hear about it! How has God been at work in your life over all the Advents you've had? What does it mean in your life to see Christ born anew into this world, into your life, into our hearts? Submissions are welcome at ebeall@wesleymemorial.org or by dropping off a hard copy at the front desk. Guidelines:

- The devotion should be less than 450 words (less than 1 typed page). Alternatively, it could be a poem, a drawing, or other media you feel led to.
- There will be no specific topics assigned this year; the subject of Advent/Christmas is broad enough. Erin can assign you a Scripture to work with, if that would be helpful to you.
- There is no need to write a prayer at the end, unless you want to.
- Feel free to utilize devotions, quotations, or stories that have been meaningful to you, as long as you cite your source.

 The ABSOLUTE DEADLINE for the devotions to be turned in is Friday, November 7. The earlier we could have them turned in, the better!

HOW DOES THE HIGH POINT JAIL MINISTRY MAKE A DIF-FERENCE?

It is the belief of the High Point Jail Ministry that the only way an inmate can leave the jail and become a productive citizen is through a personal relationship **JAIL MINISTRY** with God through Jesus Christ. It is, therefore, the ministry's



goal to give all inmates, who are willing to participate, an opportunity to learn how to enter into a relationship with Christ and then to give them opportunities to grow into disciples of Christ and become productive citizens in our community.

HOW IS THIS ACCOMPLISHED?

Volunteers from local churches come to the jail on a regular basis to mentor, teach, and lead in worship and Bible studies, listen and care.

The HPJM is a Christian outreach program offering inmates a chance to turn their lives around. Each week, 45-50 Volunteers provide over 80 hours of classes for inmates.

Through Volunteers, the Christian community brings its best resources for substance abuse, recovery, spiritual enrichment, and personal growth. The ministry is non-profit, inter-racial, and non-denominational.

The Board of Directors provides a full time Executive Director/Chaplain plus a part-time assistant Chaplain. Together, they offer inmates and families oneon-one spiritual guidance and counseling.

WHAT DO WE PROVIDE INMATES?

VOLUNTEERS from local churches, including many from Wesley Memorial, that provide worship service and bible studies in English and Spanish. There are 42 opportunities each week.

MONDAY NIGHT VISITATION: Each Monday evening, about 20 volunteers gather for prayer, then disperse to all floors of the High Point Detention Center to greet inmates, share testimonies, devotions, read scripture, share the love of Christ, and begin a relationship. Throughout the week, the following materials and programs are provided: BIBLES, PROJECT AN-GEL TREE, LIFE ENRICHMENT CLASSES, CELEBRATE

RECOVERY, AA & NA MEETINGS, "GOING FOR THE GOLD" SEMINARS, AFTER CARE, CHRIST-CENTERED SPEECH CRAFTERS, ANGER MANAGEMENT & BUILD-ING HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS, AS WELL AS PROVID-ING A LIBRARY OF APPROPRIATE READING MATE-RIAL.

Since 90% of the inmates are residents of Guilford County, the Ministry affects the quality of life for all of us. To quote Sheriff B. J. Barnes, "I think we will be better served if they (inmates) return to society exposed to the Grace of God." We agree. Last year over 140 professions of faith were recorded. All Glory to God!

The Chancel Choir is working on special anthems for All Saints Day and Commitment Sunday. On November 2, the Chancel Choir will sing one of Brahms' most well-known choral works, "How Lovely Is Thy Dwelling Place". The text of this great choral work is from Psalm 84 and expresses a longing for the Lord of hosts and praises the name of the Lord. On Commitment Sunday the choir will sing Paul Langston's great anthem, "God of Grace and God of Glory". The **Choral Scholars** will sing this anthem at the 8:30 worship service as well. The Chancel Choir is also preparing music for Advent, Christmas and Lovefeast. On December 7, they will sing for worship "A Ceremony of Carols" by Benjamin Britten with double harp accompaniment. This dramatic and energetic work was composed using poems from the 14-16 centuries. The second movement traces the entire Christmas season from the birth of Christ to the Feast of Candlemas on February 2. Several movements are about the Virgin Mary and the lowliness of Christ's birth. The sixth movement depicts the struggle between good and evil and how Christ will not conquer with the sword or an army, but with love. The work ends as it begins, with Gregorian Chant.

Adult Handbells will ring for worship on November 9. They are currently rehearsing music to ring during Advent and Christmas. TJ Webb, Neil Brown, Hao Tong, Grayson Frye, Kaylee Hutchens, Charley Doak, Hampton Helsabeck, and Mary Lyle Frye are doing a fantastic job in Youth Handbells. They are resuming rehearsals on November 2 at 5:00 in the bell room to prepare to ring on December 7 and at the 11 pm Christmas Eve service.
