

#### This month Wesley Memorial has taken our first steps into the world of community gardening.

First, we have partnered with our friends at Macedonia Family Resource Center and on May 2 built 15 raised garden beds (each bed is 4 feet by 10 feet) on the MFRC campus. They already have about 28 of these beds that they make available to the people of their neighborhood, but they have a waiting list. With a \$1,000 grant from the Asbury Mission Endowment Fund and 12 volunteers from Wesley Memorial, we purchased the materials (lumber, soil, and seeds) and built 15 new garden spots.

Now, we are going to "experiment" with some raised beds on the campus of Wesley Memorial. Within the next couple of weeks, we are going to build about 5 to 10 raised beds and make them available to Wesley Memorial members and/or groups for planting. Persons and/or groups interested in planting and tending one of the beds will be asked to contribute \$20 AND donate all the produce raised in their bed to one of the community ministries. Then, if our experiment works, next spring we will expand the number of gardening beds on our campus and begin a community garden for our neighbors on this campus.
