

# Read about Emily Robbian's recent mission trip to Honduras

During the week of June 20-27, I served on a mission team in partnership with Carolina Cross Connection and First United Methodist Church in Salisbury, NC, in San Pedro Sula and Peña Blanca, Honduras. We worked in an orphanage and a facility for adults with special needs. At an orphanage called Hogar Esperanza, we served by building a garden and garden beds for the children there, so that they could grow their own food. Our days consisted of waking up very early, eating breakfast, an hour and a half bumpy ride to the orphanage to build garden beds. My favorite part was playing fútbol (soccer). The children loved soccer and everything about the game, such as running and trickery. No one cared about getting dirty because we were having fun. Another part of our week was spent leading a vacation bible school called Refugio. The children who attended were from orphanages in San Pedro and the surrounding area. There were around 100 kids staying with us at camp. We worshipped, had small groups, and played games. I was proud that my team placed third in the soccer tournament.

God truly opened my eyes to what was out there besides the United States. Our theme for the week was "Kingdom Come." The theme was the driving force behind the experience of the majority of our team. It didn't matter that we were rich or poor, had a different education than them, and they had better food than the United States- we are all in the body of Christ as believers. We are all called home to his kingdom. One thing that I have come to recognize from being a missionary is that I was called to go and serve those people, but in reality, I was called to go and see how God is working in their lives and to listen and experience the humility of people living in poverty. Thank you very much for your prayers, your gifts, and your faithfulness to serve in the United States and beyond.
