Summer Sunday School In "The Greenhouse"



Mission and Community Impact...





Wesley 100 working on a project at Hinton Rural Life Center that was funded by Wesley Memorial.

The Mission and Community Impact Team (MCIT) and the Wesley 100 have partnered to support the ministry of Hinton Rural Life Center (Hayesville, NC). The MCIT has made a grant to Hinton Center from budgeted funds. One grant was to fund building a tool shed for their firewood ministry (provides firewood to low income households in this mountain county) and to build a handicap accessible deck on one of the retreat houses (retreat houses help fund the outreach). Members of our Wesley 100 went to Hinton Center earlier last month a built the tool shed and handicap accessible ramp. They also directed the expenditure of half of the 2015 income from the Asbury Endowment Fund to purchase a greenhouse for the community garden at Hinton Center. The garden not only provides for the Hinton Center kitchen but also for the local community food bank.
