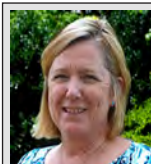

TWO New Series in October: Power Play & Real Talk



This month, we have two 2-week series happening on Sunday mornings. Our series titles are "Real Talk" and "Power Play".

Real Talk: Talking to some people is easy. You can hang out with your friends for hours and never run out of anything to say. You feel like you can talk to them about anything. But you probably also know people who just seem to make you a little nervous when you have to talk to them. But what if talking to God was never meant to be that way? What if talking to God was supposed to feel more like chatting with a good Friend than making an impressive speech? During this series, we're going to take a look at what Jesus said prayer is and isn't. And as we do, you may just find yourself wanting to lay down the formalities, relax and have some real talk.

Power Play: Power is a good thing. And in most cases, more power is a better thing. We want our phones to be powered up, our cars to be powerful, our laptops to be powered on, and our football teams made of power players. But those aren't the only places that power is important to us. We all want to have power in relationships too. During this series we're going to talk about two people from the New Testament who looked at power differently than anyone else: Paul and Jesus. In their stories, we find that, no matter who is in control, there is always a power play we can make on behalf of others.

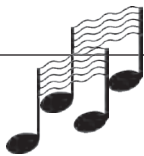

Another special presentation will take place at 11 am on Sunday, October 11. Children who have participated in **Children's Music for grades 2-5** will sing and ring chimes for the introit.

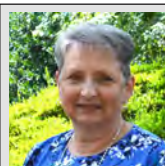

Feeding The Hungry

When the disciples asked Jesus what to do about feeding the hungry who had come to hear him, Jesus told them, "You give them something to eat." (Mark 6:37) Wesley Memorial is trying to respond to his command. Here is an update on some of the feeding ministries at Wesley Memorial.

- The 34th Annual Crop Walk was held on Sunday, September 27 and hosted by First Baptist Church. Of the 400 people walking, about a dozen walkers came from Wesley Memorial. Wesley Memorial raised around \$1,200 towards the community goal of \$43,000 which will be divided between High Point's Open Door Ministries and the worldwide feeding programs supported by Church World Service.
- In April, Wesley Memorial's Mission & Community Impact team funded a \$5,000 grant to Ansanm Ministries for a community garden in Bernaco, Haiti. After the earthquake in 2010, children and orphans from Port-au-Prince fled to family in nearby communities, one of which was Bernaco. These families struggle with feeding and caring for so many extra children. A two acre community garden was established last spring to help combat malnutrition and teach farming skills. Within the last few weeks, the harvest has come in and the community has new produce with which to feed over 500 people in and around the small village. With their water pump and irrigation system, leaders hope to plant again during the winter months.
- The summer "community garden" on our campus produced just shy of 500 pounds of produce which was all donated to Our Father's Table at Open Door Ministries. Our "gardeners" led by Bob Bass have now planted a fall garden of beets, broccoli, turnips, and cabbage, which will also be donated to Our Father's Table. They are making plans to expand the number of beds in the garden next spring.

New Worship Time

On October 4, the start time for the 8:45 will move to 8:30. The Worship Team and Church Council decided to make this change after several months of prayerful consideration.

The new start time will allow for flexibility and fellowship in the contemporary services. Specifically, it will (1) permit each contemporary service to have a full 60-minute service, (2) allow the praise team, band, and worship leaders to have time to transition between each service, (3) encourage time for fellowship after and before each service, and (4) promote the integrity of the Sunday School by allowing the classes to start and end on time.

In making this decision, the Worship Team and Church Council also affirmed the continuation of four Sunday morning worship services (2 contemporary and 2 traditional) and a fifth worship service on Wednesday mornings at 11 am.

You will also be interested to know that the Worship Team has had two national leaders in the field of worship observe all our four services on two different occasions. They were each impressed by the quality of the space, music, liturgy and people that blend together to make worship at Wesley Memorial meaningful.

On October 4, which happens to be World Communion Sunday, we hope to see everyone either at 8:30 in the Chapel (traditional), 8:30 in the Fellowship Hall (contemporary), 9:45 in the Fellowship Hall (contemporary) or 11:00 in the Sanctuary (traditional).
