We are delighted to announce that the Reverend Dr. Jeff Patterson will be joining us as Wesley Memorial's new senior pastor. His first Sunday will be July 16.

Jeff, a native of Gastonia, NC, has served in Winston-Salem as the Yadkin Valley District

Superintendent for the Western North Carolina Conference for the past three years.

Previously, he was senior pastor at Main Street United Methodist in Kernersville for six years and prior to that at Aldersgate United Methodist in Shelby for eight years. He began his ministry at Montlieu Avenue UMC in High Point (1986-1990). Other appointments include Thrift UMC in Charlotte (1990-95), Archdale UMC (1995-99) and First UMC in Franklin (1999-2001).

Under Jeff's leadership, each of the congregations he has served has grown in both

attendance and stewardship.



Grants



Thus far this year, the Church Council has approved the recommendation of the Mission and Community Impact Team to award mission and ministry grants to the following partner ministries in the Triad.

\$1000 for the YWCA's Baby Basics Closet that provides diapers, wipes, clothes and other baby care items to more than 600 families per year.

\$4500 for Wheels4Hope that helps qualified applicants purchase used/rehabilitated automobiles.

\$1100 for World Relief to get water connected to an abandoned lot in High Point used by immigrant families for a garden.

\$2500 for Mobile Meals of High Point delivers a nutritious meal to homebound senior adults over age 60 and unable to cook for themselves or have no one available to assist them.

\$5500 for the Baseball Program at Macedonia Family Resource Center. This program gives Inner-city boys and girls ages 9-12 an opportunity to participate in a baseball league.

\$5000 to Wesley Memorial's Local Relief Fund that enables our clergy to assist our neighbors with emergency needs (food, housing, utilities). In 2016, we distributed more than \$10,000 through the Local Relief Fund.

\$8400 to help with Wesley Memorial teams providing and serving meals at Our Father's Table and Ward Street Mission.

"Partner ministries" are non-profit agencies whose mission is compatible with the mission of Wesley Memorial. The funds for these grants come from the 2017 operating budget and represent 4.5% of the 2017 pledges.

Children's Music finished its year with 19 children singing on Palm Sunday and even more participating in the palm processional. This wonderful group of children, ages K-5th grade, will start another year next fall. Thanks to all parents who brought the children early on the selected Sundays for rehearsal and worship participation.

After Easter, most music ensembles at Wesley Memorial begin their break until school starts again in the fall. The Chancel Choir is the only exception. While many of its members are gone for long periods in spring and summer, this choir rehearses throughout the year with a few exceptions in summer months. This is why we need YOU! Please consider joining the Chancel Choir, if only from May through August. Check with a choir member before coming to rehearsal to verify which nights the choir is taking a "vacation" from rehearsal.

During the summer, the **Chancel Choir** uses rehearsal time to prepare summer anthems but also to get a head start on fall, Advent and Christmas music. Yes, we sing Christmas music in the summer!

After May 14 and May 21 the JuBELLation Choir and Chancel Bells, take their break from rehearsals. They will start again in the fall.

JuBELLation Choir is a handbell choir for mostly students and some adults. If your student rang in the Wesley Handbell Choir and will be in the sixth grade next fall, I hope he or she will move up to JuBELLation Choir in September. We will schedule choir around Confirmation Classes which also meet on Sunday afternoons. If you have a student who has never rung and would like to ring handbells we can accommodate him or her too. We are grateful to our Handbell Quartet which sometimes rehearses during the summer and provides music for worship when most choirs are taking the summer off.

This course will utilize numerous resources, from books like *Executing Grace* by Shane Claiborne and *Just Mercy* by Bryan Stevenson, to movies like *Dead Man Walking* starring Susan Sarandon, to art and music from real NC death row inmates.
