


Vacation Bible School Mission Project



lay caring ministry that equips and empowers caregiverscalled Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential. Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. Care receivers may be going through a divorce, grieving a loss, or find themselves in an uncertain season of life. Through 50 hours of thorough training, Stephen Ministers learn how to provide appropriate care to others. Stephen Ministers repeatedly say that training helps them grow in their faith, and strengthens relationships with family and friends.

Stephen ministry training will take place on Tuesdays from 6:00 -8:30 pm starting August 21.






