Because Jesus has bought us as his people with the price of his blood, our whole lives should be an expression of our gratitude. The work of God in Jesus is redemption. Our lives should be expressions of gratitude. As Jesus

People in the world, we express our gratitude to Jesus by the way we live.

As those who follow Jesus, we should seek to live as Jesus lived. We should be focused on the kingdom of God as Jesus was focused on the kingdom of God. We should seek to forgive as Jesus forgives, love as Jesus loves, be compassionate as Jesus is compassionate, and serve humanity as Jesus serves humanity. Our relationship to power and riches should express that we are following Jesus. As Jesus People, we should seek to be broken bread and poured out wine for the sake of the world.

Living a Jesus-centered life will make us countercultural. As individuals or congregations, the way we use our resources (time, talent, finances, property) should express to the world that we are Jesus People. Our calendars and our schedules should express to the world that we are Jesus People. Our financial records should express that we want to follow Jesus more than anything else the world offers. Our hope and dreams should express that we are Jesus People.

When people experience us or our congregations, they should experience Jesus. One of the Bible verses that I hope guides my life is Paul's words in Galatians 2:20 "I have been crucified with Christ and yet I am alive; yet it is no longer I, but Christ living in me" (Jerusalem Bible). I seek to crucify my will, my desires, my agendas, and my preferences, so that my life may be guided by the will, desires, agendas, and preferences of Christ.

Will you join me in this adventure as we follow closely in the dust of Rabbi Jesus as he roams the world?



Summer Enrichment

Dear Families,



Summer is coming! Let us be a part of your child's summer. This summer we are offering a camp style summer program for infants through rising first graders. Our Wesley Memorial School Summer Camp will begin on Tuesday, June 5 and conclude on Friday, August

3. We will not be open the week of July 4th Holiday. Camp hours are from 8am to 1pm Monday through Friday. Our summer camp program will therefore be eight weeks of themed fun, learning, and special opportunities. Parents will need to *pack a lunch every day*. The children will have a snack daily and parents will sign up to bring in snack as we do during the school year. If your child is enrolled in the WMS Summer Camp, they will automatically be enrolled in our Enrichment weeks at no additional charge.

Tuition is only \$100.00 per week. Classes will be



structured per age level; therefore, spaces are limited. Because spaces are limited you are committing for at least six of our eight weeks. Tuition may be paid in total for the summer, monthly, or weekly. However, if you choose to pay weekly, tuition *must be*

paid by Monday at drop off.

June 5 - June 8: Planting in the Garden June 11 - June 15: Ecology / our Earth

*June 18 - June 22: Music! / Drama

June 25 - June 29: Sports / Fitness and Health

Simply complete a registration form and return with the \$20.00 registration fee. If you choose to enroll for only our **Enrichment weeks (*)**, the tuition for the week (M-F, 8am – 1pm) is \$125.00. *Registration and tuition payment for Enrichment weeks are due at registration time.*


There is a fellowship among choir members—a dedicated group of people who make weekly rehearsals part of their life's pattern. Your paths may not cross in
