High Point will live more into God's dream for our world. We will "promote the welfare of the city" (Jeremiah 29:7) by living authentic, Christlike lives.



## Taking Our Death Penalty Study

#### To Heart...

I wasn't sure what to expect when I decided to participate in the recent Death Penalty Study. I knew I had a brokenness in me related to a terrible, violent crime committed against my family nearly a half a century ago that I have struggled all my life to heal. I knew how I felt about the death penalty. I understood how appearing before a parole board every five years fails to provide closure for a victim's family. I suspected I wanted to hear that my desire for punishment was vindicated.

But I also knew that I was hungry to hear what the word of God says about the death penalty. The Old Testament cries out for "an eye for an eye" as a means of setting the nation of Israel apart from her neighbors by seeking mercy and justice for crimes. The Psalmist pleads for his enemies to be brought to justice by the righteousness of



God. Time and time again, the justice of God was demonstrated to His people and upon their enemies.

Yet the message of Christ is one of love and forgiveness and compassion. Could it be that my desire for justice was counter to the teachings of Jesus? Was it possible that by holding onto my yearning to see a court-ordered sentence upheld, I was actually turning away from my relationship with God?

When I walked into the Media Center that first Sunday evening, I ached to reconcile the duality in my own heart between a desire for quick and mighty justice, and a profound longing for forgiveness and healing. I joined about a dozen others in a series of discussions. both lighthearted and solemn, focused on a variety of aspects of the death penalty. That first evening we began our conversations by sharing what would we chose for our last meal, if we were

on death row. We then moved into more serious discussions concerning capital punishment in the Bible. Stories of martyrdom, murder and punishment fill the pages. Yet alongside these tales are examples of forgiveness, reconciliation and mercy.

The following weeks found us discussing death row statistics, the official stance of the United Methodist Church, and wrongful convictions. We spoke about jury duty, dying with dignity and victims' rights. For homework, we watched pop culture media with themes focused on incarceration and death row – "Pit Bulls and Parolees" and "Dead Man Walking." We read excerpts from books with overarching themes of mercy in the justice system – <u>Just Mercy</u> and <u>Executing Grace</u>. We watched video interviews from people currently on death row in North Carolina.

And, on the last night, we talked about forgiveness and the powerful impact it can have on both the victim and the perpetrator. We leaned into our understanding of a loving Father in heaven who extends forgiveness to all who seek it, no matter the gravity of their sin. And we discovered that despite our differences, there are still parts of the death penalty on which we can agree.

Last week, our family was notified that we will need to travel to Montgomery, Alabama in the fall to again oppose the parole of Eddie Seibold. While I am still unable to forgive him, I was, finally, able to ask God to begin to soften my heart towards him, as a child of God.




