From Our Pastor



HEARING FROM GOD

God is still speaking. God speaks to us through Scripture,

prayer, the communion of the saints, and the circumstances of our life.

Hearing the Voice of God requires stillness and silence. We live in a

frenetic world of ceaseless activity and constant noise. Hearing the Voice of God requires that we make sacred time and empty space in our lives. We have to learn how to seek solitude so that we have room in our lives for God.

Hearing the Voice of God requires a knowledge of Scripture. The Bible is

the primary tool that we use to discern the will and wishes of God. The Bible teaches us to recognize God's Voice. Through a meditative, slow reading of Scripture (*lectio divina*), we can hear the Voice. We should go to the Bible not so much for information with the learning of facts, but transformation as we hear the Voice.

Hearing the Voice of God requires humility. We must be quick to acknowledge that we do not know all that we could or need to know. We must desire the Voice of God the way that a barren desert desires rain. We must be willing to let go of prejudices and preconceived ideas that can prevent us from hearing the Voice.

Hearing the Voice of God requires a spirit of obedience. Disciple One Bible Study taught that God does not reveal God's will to the curious, but to the obedient. We must choose obedience first and then God might be pleased to reveal God's will to us. God does not reveal God's will to the curious, but to the obedient. We have to say 'yes' first and then hear what God requires of us. Often God just gives us enough guidance to take the next step even though we would like to see the whole path before us before we start the journey. Henri Nouwen wrote that we must have "an evergreen openness to let the spirit of Jesus blow in us where it pleases." (*Discernment: Reading the Signs of Daily Life*, HarperOne, 2013)

The living of these days requires great wisdom, not just knowledge but wisdom. God desires to speak wisdom into our lives. May we be a people who live so closely to the Living Christ that we hear the Voice in our lives.







The Wesley 100 - A Few Semi-Good Men

The Wesley 100 is Wesley Memorial's United Methodist Men's group. Our goal is to offer the men of the church a place to be the hands and feet of Christ and help Wesley Memorial's mission of making Disciples of Christ.

The Wesley 100 was started about 12 years ago when two of us decided we needed a dedicated men's ministry at Wesley Memorial, something we had not had for many years. While our name contains the number 100, we are really the faithful 15 - 20, so we still have a lot of room for more men.

Our name comes from a quote by John Wesley. There are several versions of the quote but he basically said "Give me one hundred men who fear nothing but sin and desire nothing but God, and I care not whether they be clergyman or laymen, they alone will shake the gates of Hell." John could be pretty salty.

The Bible verse we have chosen for the Wesley 100 is Proverbs 27:17: "As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another." We are here to do God's work, to further the missions of church and to help and encourage each other in our walks with Christ.

While the records of what we have done are not the best, over the past four years these men have raised and distributed over \$40,000 in support of the ministries and missions of the church, both local, national and global. We have also contributed our time and labor in support of many Church events and missions.

Here is a partial list of the things the Wesley 100 has done over the past few years:

-Raised funds for scholarships for the Wesley Memorial School.

-Provided funds to help defray the cost of our Youth group's summer camp so more could attend.

-Remodeled a house for a refugee family from Africa.

- -Building projects at the United Methodist Hinton Rural Life Center in Hinton, NC.
- -Provided funding for building teams going to Puerto Rico and Henderson Settlement in KY.
- -Raised money to support Feeding Lisa's Kids.
- -Served numerous meals at Ward Street.
- -Sponsored mission trips to Latvia.
- -Annually fund scholarships for two students at the Wesley Memorial School in Kenya.
- -Bought a milk cow for the school in Kenya, it had a calf so they now have a herd.
- -Sponsored a student mission trip to NYC.
- -Provided funds to help build Churches in Puerto Rico.
- -Provided funding to help train a service dog for a veteran through Patriot Rovers.
- -Are helping to remodel a house for homeless veterans for the group "Heal Our Heroes" at the John Wesley Camp in High Point.
- -Cooked and served hundreds of meals for Wednesday Night dinners at the Church.
- -Cooked and served thousands of hot dogs for SpringFest, Trunk or Treat, the Prison Ministries Angel Tree Christmas Party and Fairview Elementary School.

I know there are many things I've missed, but if 15 - 20 men working for the Lord can do this much, I think John Wesley was right..... 100 men who want to serve God could really shake things up.

For any men who want to check us out, we meet the third Saturday of each month at 8:00 am for breakfast in the dining hall, or you can ask any member of the group.




Want to learn more about Wesley Memorial? Thinking about membership?
