

From Our Senior Pastor

Church Life During A Pandemic

*“I am about to do a new thing;
now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?
I will make a way in the wilderness
and rivers in the desert”
(Isaiah 43:19)*

Nothing in seminary nor life could have prepared me for leading a staff and congregation during a pandemic. We truly have been building an airplane and flying it at the same time. We have all had to think in new ways and learn new behaviors. Creativity has always been important in ministry, but in recent months creativity has become essential. Many of us are living examples that old dogs can really be taught new tricks!

Massive use of internet technology, recorded worship services, and observing numerous COVID-19 health protocols for safety have become a big part of our lives in the church. Being a congregation with great restrictions on gathering has been an unprecedented challenge. We all have learned new ways to stay connected and support each other. Living daily with the loss of personal contact and normal routines has been a struggle. As a pastor, perhaps the hardest thing for me is to be physically separated from those who suffer. Even when proximity was a possibility, we have refrained from hugs and other physical signs of support. Challenge, loss and sadness have surrounded us.

We all have become exhausted and frustrated by living through the pandemic. But, in our weariness, we remember that God is good all the time. God always comes through for us. As God said through the prophet Isaiah, there are times when he does a “*new thing.*” God tells us that he “*will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.*” God always makes a way when there seems to be no way.

I cannot refrain from weeping when I think about all that God has done for our congregation during the pandemic. We are a blessed people. We have maintained a worship life, the Gospel has continued to go forth, new people have been reached, new members have joined our congregation, small groups have found creative ways to meet and grow together, people have been intentional about reaching out to those who need love and encouragement, and people’s generous support for the ministry and mission of our congregation has been remarkable. We have been surrounded by God’s abundance and people’s generosity.

Along with God, we grieve the deaths of over 500,000 Americans. This is more American deaths than we experienced in World War I, World War II, and the Vietnam Conflict. I know that we will learn some more lessons before this pandemic is over. We are all tired and ready for a new day, but I hope that the lessons of the pandemic have changed us permanently for good. I hope that we all have learned some enduring lessons about the importance of relationships and the reality of our mortality. And, we have been powerfully reminded that God always comes through for us. God has never failed us.

Children's Ministries

Through God's grace, the Wesley Memorial Kids children's ministry is growing during the pandemic. Since October, dozens of kids and volunteer leaders have met safely in-person for Sunday School at 9:45 each week, enjoying a fun, hands-on, Bible-centered curriculum that is prompting us all to grow in faith, prayer, and knowledge of God.



Since January, Wednesday Night Kids Games & Gospel has met each week to share snacks, energy-filled games, laughter, and a fun Bible lesson. Also in-person, we've started to offer a wonderful Family Resource table in the Bridge Cafe area filled with free devotional opportunities for families to take home and use as they grow together in faith.

Social distancing has not stopped us from safely blessing 17 children with their Wesley Memorial Bibles, holding a Bible Retreat, filming a nativity play and worship song, and holding a Kids Night Out Valentine Event that brought kids together to learn about God's love.

For families who want to stay home, we have been offering weekly church-at-home resources including lesson and music videos, printable activity sheets, and more. The pandemic has prompted Wesley Memorial Kids to reach hundreds of people in the community with

creative and safe drive-through experiences, including a *Heroes Unmasked* Drive-Through Fall Festival where kids heard about true Bible heroes, played games, and received candy and toys.

At Christmas, the *What God Wants for Christmas* experience told the Christmas story in a way that demonstrated God's great love for hundreds of people who drove through our church campus. We also distributed more than 50 Advent bags at Christmas, guiding kids and families in a Christmas cookie-baking activity that shared the Christmas story.



In the New Year, families received Valentine's Bags, which included postcards for the kids to decorate and mail to shut-in members of the congregation. Also, more than 60 take-home Lenten Bags are out right now so families can learn about God and worship together in meaningful, hands-on ways throughout the Easter season.

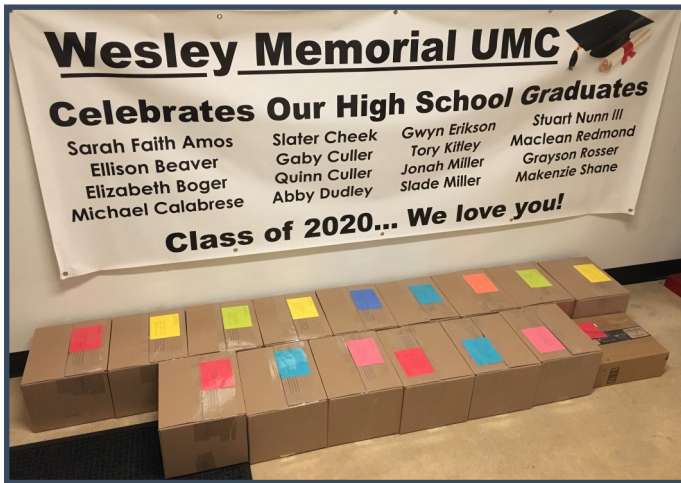

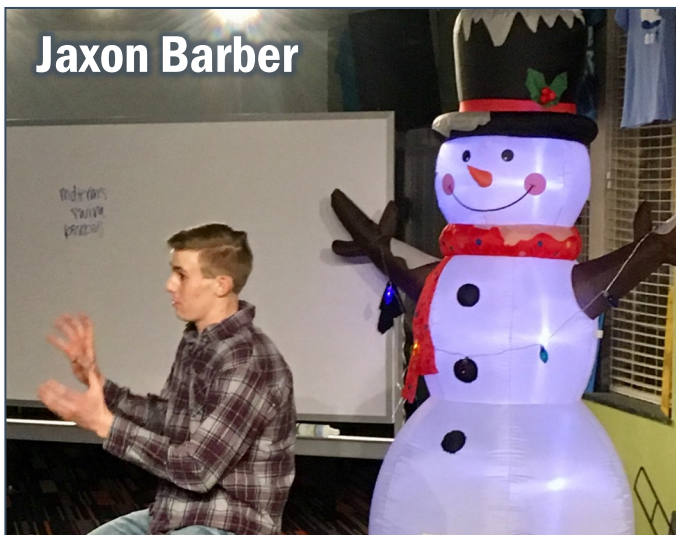
Student Ministries

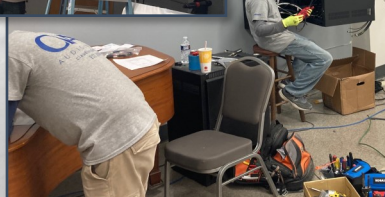

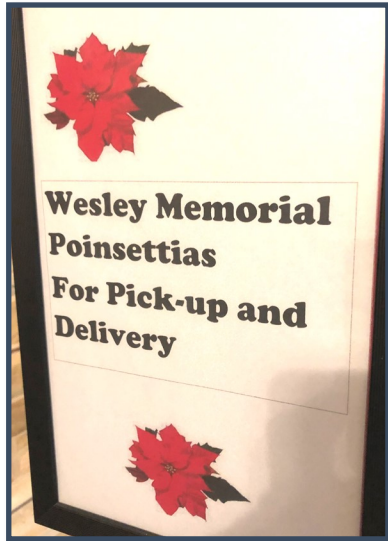

Congregational Care

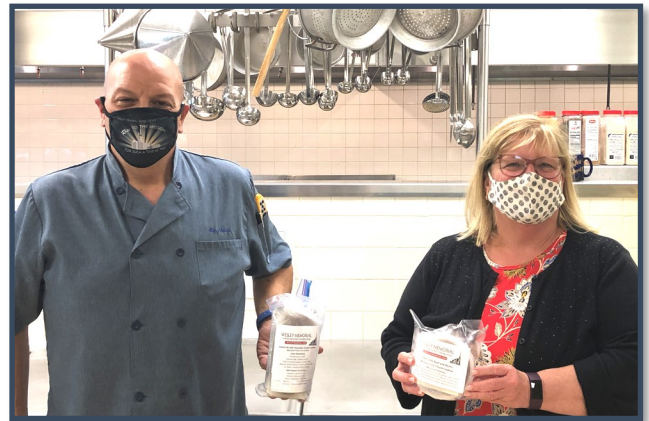

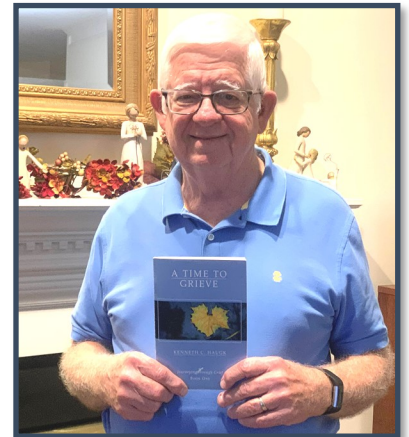
deliveries brightened the day of so many individuals. If you did not have the opportunity to deliver a poinsettia at Christmas, I invite you to consider taking part in our upcoming

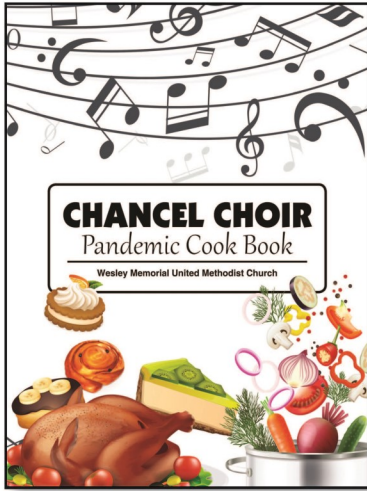

This past Fall the chancel choir went to work looking through their treasured recipes. Recipes were gathered, categorized, and typeset. The pandemic cookbook was professionally printed and distributed to chancel choir members. This was an exciting project for the chancel choir. Christmas From Wesley Memorial

Christmas From Wesley Memorial was the 7:00pm televised 2020 Christmas Eve Service, which we produced, for the CW broadcasting network. Frank had only nine days to put the service together. A professional film crew from Charlotte was hired and we filmed at night to give the impression and look of an evening service.
