

Steve Jobs and Apple didn't just produce new technology, they changed the way we related to technology. They have created a culture.





Have you ever eaten a great southern tomato pie? I love them! One day, I decided to try to make one myself. At the end of my cooking adventure, I had in front of me nothing more than a disgusting, mushy mess! What went so wrong? I thought through everything in the recipe and remembered that I had skipped one of the instructions... salt the tomatoes first. I had skipped that part absent mindedly, because I didn't think it was relevant or important. I thought it would take too long to salt it and then


wait 30 minutes and that it did not really matter because we could just salt it to taste at the table anyway. However, I learned a valuable lesson that day about making a tomato pie. When you salt the tomatoes, the salt causes them to release their juices.

Gratitude in our lives is like the salt that causes the juices of generosity to flow forth naturally in our lives. There are other ways to force the juices out - like pressing them hard with hammer, smashing the essential element of the tomato in the process. But that is like when you give from compulsion, being forced. It is not very pretty and tends to be painful. God invites us to give freely. To have the generosity flow forth from a thankful heart. This is like the recipe that creates a fruitful and delicious tomato pie - not mushy or watery or smashed.

Are you living generously? In your finances, with your time, with your gifts/ talents? Are they flowing forth from a life salted by gratitude for all that God has

given unto you? Generosity is about our hearts and lives growing as disciples, out of our thanksgiving unto God.

We live in a society and culture here in America, that has become more and more materialistic and consumer driven. In



fact, this consumeristic approach to living feeds an insatiable need to find our fulfillment and security in money and stuff which we have accumulated. This consumeristic mindset has fed our discontentment.

Giving generously of our financial resources to God, helps remind us of our dependence upon God and security in Him alone. Today, may you be filled with the joy of gratitude flowing forth in fruitful generosity.


